

LAKESIDE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH PRAYS FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION

Americans gave more than \$30 billion dollars in bequests made through wills and estate plans in 2016, according to a 2017 Giving USA report. But few churches talk to their members about how they can make such gifts to their churches after the end of their earthly life, and we must be reminded as churchgoers that we have benefited from Christians who came before them. So, we then know that, "We are all beneficiaries of somebody else's generosity," Therefore, "Each of us has the opportunity to do the same for the next generation." The Presbyterian Church (USA) asks, us to lift this idea of estate planning and the possible notion that we might remember our church family as we do.

When we Christians plan our estates, we face the same considerations everyone else does – persons, properties and plans to provide for. But we also have a consideration that is unique to persons in the church – "Should the church be included in my will?" As more and more thoughtful Christians ponder this issue we hear many helpful statements about why people are learning the satisfaction of giving to the ministries of the church through a Christian will.

You see planned giving is a powerful means of expressing Christian stewardship. Planned giving can be achieved through a bequest in a will (either by a direct gift or in a trust provision) or through such avenues as a life insurance designation, a gift of retirement plan assets, a gift annuity, a charitable trust, or other types of trusts.

The following discussion outlines simple ways by which direct gifts may be made to the Church through one's will. Consider your love for the Lord, your love for your Lakeside church home and family, please give some consideration to supporting the ongoing ministry of this wonderful church through your planned giving, as you leave the legacy of your love and life as you take your place in God's glory.



EPIPHANY – JANUARY 6, 2025

And every January, this year on Jan. 20, we celebrate Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday and the inspiring legacy he left behind, now more than 50 years after his assassination in 1968. Presbyterians have set the Sunday prior to this National Holiday as our "Peace and Justice Sunday" as we pray and work for human care and kindness worldwide.




He was known for his speeches, sermons and inspirational writings that aimed to motivate society to push for change. His most notable speech was "I Have a Dream," presented in 1963—which you may recall reading in history class.

As Presbyterians we too have a dream born out not of societal grievances but out of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. Our dream for justice and love is rooted in Matthew's account of a Sermon on the Mount and out of our Lord's saying regarding, "what you have done to the least of these you have done it as unto me."

The Kirkin' o' th' Tartans January 26, 2025

This Sunday all over the world many churches will observe the Kirkin' o' th' Tartans, a celebration of Scottish heritage and culture. While the Kirkin' o' th' Tartans service celebrates Scotland and Scottish heritage, it is a truly a Scottish-American custom. Stories abound of the Kirkin's roots being in days of the Act of Proscription, when the wearing of the kilt was banned in the Highlands – according to the legend, Highlanders hid pieces of tartan and brought them to church to be secretly blessed at a particular point in the service. The Kirkin date is usually set in relation to the famous Scottish poet's birthday of January 25th and the

acceptance of what is known as Robert Burns Day or Rabbie Burns day. In Scottish Societies there is a Burns supper that is dedicated to the life and poetry of Robert Burns where many of his poems are read. The meal is brought in, and his Selkirk Grace is said before the meal is enjoyed:

has been set aside as Per Capita Sunday, a day to celebrate being a connectional church. The Epistle lesson for us to further understand the depth of this commitment is I Corinthians 12:12-31 which starts: "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body." Being a connectional church takes both the contribution of gifts to per capita and the work of pastors and elders who together advise, guide, and govern our General Assembly, Synod of South Atlantic and the Presbytery of Tropical Florida.

Every church within the PCUSA has a responsibility to make a Per Capita payment annually This amount is based on the church's active membership and the determined amount per member which for 2025 is \$37.89. INTERNATIONAL HOLOCAUST REMEMBERANCE DAY

JANUARY 27, 2025, THE 80TH ANNIVERSARY

On January 27, 2025, we will commemorate the 80th anniversary of the liberation of the German Nazi concentration and extermination camp known as Auschwitz. One of the symbols of the commemoration will be a freight car that will stand directly in front of the gate.

Until the liberation of some 7 thousand prisoners remaining at the site of the camp by soldiers of the Red Army, the German Nazis murdered approximately 1.1 million people in Auschwitz, mostly Jews, but also other nationalities such as Poles, the Roma, and Soviet prisoners of war. For the world today, Auschwitz is a symbol of the Holocaust and the atrocities of World War II. In 2005 the United Nations declared January 27 as International Holocaust Remembrance Day.


